PENSION INCREASE

People who receive a state pension will find their income increases by the highest amount since 2012 in April. The weekly pension for people who reached state pension age after 6th April 2016 will rise to £175.20. Those who reached pension age before this will receive £134.25 a week.

JACK'S LAW

In April, the Parental Bereavement Leave and Pay Act (Jack's Law) will come into force. All employed parents who lose a child under the age of 18, including stillbirths from 24 weeks, will be entitled to two weeks' leave.

LIVING WAGE INCREASE

The National Living Wage (for workers aged 25 and over) will increase to £8.72 per hour in April. The National Minimum Wage will increase to £8.20 per hour for 21-24 year olds, to £6.45 per hour for 18-20 year olds and to £4.55 per hour for under 18s.

UC Universal Credit

BENEFITS FREEZE ENDS

The benefits freeze will end in April which means payments for working-age benefits such as Universal Credit and Job Seeker's Allowance could increase by 1.7%.

TV LICENCE CHARGES

From 1st June people aged 75 and over will only be able to claim a free TV licence if they claim Pension Credit. Everyone else will have to pay £154.50 a year.



CHEAP FOOD

Download the Toogoodtogo app and order a magic bag full of perfectly edible food that shops and restaurants have to throw out at the end of the day if it's not been sold. Shops in the scheme include Morrisons, Nisa Local, bakeries, pubs and hotels.

FREE DENTAL CARE

Women who are pregnant or who have had a baby in the past 12 months get free NHS dental treatment and prescriptions. Make the most of it by booking a dental check-up just before the end of your first year as a new mum!

SPRING CLEAN

There's no better time than Spring to give your home a good clean! Here's our top Spring cleaning tips.

- 1. Declutter your home. Separate items into 'keep', 'donate' and 'throw away'.
- 2. Wear rubber gloves to clean pet hair off sofas, carpets, curtains, bedding. The hairs will stick to the gloves.
- 3. Spray white vinegar on your toilet, shower and sink. Leave overnight to break down limescale.
- Wipe down walls and woodwork with a sponge and washing up liquid. Use a sponge mop for high bits.

EMERGENCY CHANGES

From 1st April until 31st October, if you experience a total loss of heating, this will not be classed as an emergency repair.

ENSURE YOU'RE INSURED!

Many residents still don't have contents insurance and it's so important to get it sorted.



It covers the cost of repairing or replacing your furniture and possessions such as clothing, jewellery, electronic goods and carpets, if they get damaged, destroyed or stolen. If you don't have insurance you'll face a hefty bill. You can usually pay for insurance in weekly or monthly instalments so find the best deal for you.

HOW TO ... HANG WALLPAPER

Here's the latest guide in our 'How to...' feature to help you keep your home looking great! Hanging wallpaper is quite a skill but with these simple steps, you'll soon get the 'hang' of it!

- Use a spirit level to draw a vertical line 50cm from the corner of the wall (if your roll is 53cm wide.)
- Apply wallpaper paste to the wall from the line, across the width of a roll.
- 3. Place the wallpaper roll on the floor, place it against the line and unroll it to the top of the wall.
- 4. Cut it about 3cm above the top of the wall.

- 5. Smooth it from the centre to the edges to smooth out any air bubbles.
- Trim any excess paper from the top and bottom with a ruler and knife.
