Support with increasing energy costs





If you're struggling to pay your energy bills, your supplier MUST work with you to agree a payment plan you can afford.

The Warm Home Discount is a one-off £150 discount on your electricity bill.

If your supplier provides you with both gas and electricity, you may be able to get the discount on your gas bill instead.

Who is eligible?

- **Core group 1**: for people who get the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit. If you qualify, you should have **received a letter** telling you how to get the discount.
- 2 Core group 2: for people on a low income and who get certain means-tested benefits. If you're in this group, you'll need to apply directly to your electricity supplier.

Warm banks If you're struggling to keep your home warm and buy food, using a warm bank / warm space may help you to free up some money.

They are safe places provided by libraries, charities, churches, community centres and local organisations, even some fire stations, where you can spend time to keep warm without having to worry about the heating bill.

Find a warm bank near you

Simple energy saving steps for every household

	Unplug: Turn devices around the home off, don't leave them on standby.	£65
X	Switch off: Turn the lights off when leaving a room.	£25
	Load them up: Run your dishwasher when it's full and using it once less each a week could save money.	£17
	Turn them down: Use your washing machine on a 30-degree cycle instead of higher temperatures and reduce it's use by one run each a week to save money.	£34
	 Heat less water: ✓ Keep your shower time to 4 minutes. ✓ Swap one bath a week with a 4-minute shower. ✓ Only boil the water you need in your kettle. 	£95 £20 £13

Severn Trent have several schemes that can help if you're struggling to pay your water bill, whatever your circumstances. They include:

Single occupier tariff



Bill cap scheme - WaterSure: Customers living with three children under 19, or a medical condition requiring extra water use. may be entitled to capped water charges.

Big Difference: Severn Trent customers, with a household income below £18,278, may be able to save up to 90% off their water bill by applying to the 'Big Difference' scheme.

The Severn Trent Trust Fund: This trust provides financial help for Severn Trent customers who have experienced exceptional circumstances that stop them being able to pay their bill.

Anglian Water can work with you to build a package of support just for you.



Reduced tariffs: They offer LITE and Extra LITE tariffs to customers on a low disposable income who are struggling to pay their water bill. Based on your individual situation you could get a discount of up to 50% on your water and sewerage charges.

Extra Care Support: They can create a personalised plan for you to manage your water payments. This may include switching tariffs, setting up an affordable payment plan, taking a payment break or support from the Anglian Water Assistance Fund.

Many broadband suppliers offer bespoke deals to help customers receiving financial support, such as Universal Credit, be able to afford broadband.
